

**John Alan Daubert** started his musical journey at the age of seven, playing accordion. Over the next few years he added drums, guitar and piano. As the drummer, he formed a band in grammar school that would play for the 8th grade dances. High school found John playing organ in one of New Jersey's top cover bands, "All Rights Reserved".

After high school, John went back to piano and with drummer, John Marnie, formed "Breakwater Bay". In 1973, "Breakwater Bay" became the house band at "Memories of Margate" at the Jersey shore. During that time, John played piano backing up many pro artists, as well as playing for the band's own sets.

After the band years ended, John turned toward writing songs with long time friend, Buddy Holcombe. For the next twenty-nine years "the team of "Daubert and Holcombe" wrote and produced countless songs. Accomplishments included scoring two college films and a licensing agreement. One song, co written with Ron Signorelli, was licensed for TV's "Fashion Television", airing in 48 countries.

Brian Austin Whitney, founder of the prestigious music networking site, "Just Plain Folks", heard one of John's songs, ("Too Little Time), and asked John if he would consider playing at a songwriter's showcase. John agreed to perform that new song, and closed the showcase with a favorable response. That challenge and result, along with the burning passion to "play out" again, inspired John to form a band to play his countless original songs.

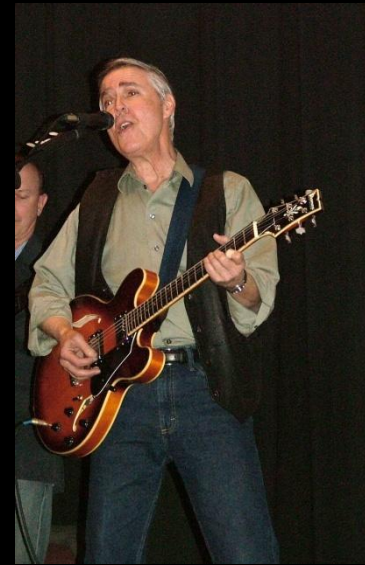
